What do VSA volunteers do?

VSA volunteers work in a wide range of areas. We have volunteers working as business mentors and teacher trainers, providing IT and legal advice, or helping develop eco-tourism ventures.

How long do VSA assignments last?

VSA assignments last for anything from three months to two years.

Do I have to pay to be a VSA volunteer?

No, you don't have to pay to be a VSA volunteer. If you are selected, VSA will pay for your airfares, accommodation, health and travel insurance, and provide a modest living allowance.

VSA asks that volunteers fundraise setting a target of \$1,000 or more. VSA's fundraising team will work alongside you to help achieve this target.

Is there an age limit for volunteers?

For insurance reasons, the upper age limit for volunteers is 75.

Can I take my partner?

We regularly place couples in assignments that last longer than six months. However, it is not possible to do this for assignments of less than six months.
